Advising Notes:

- 1. Anth 161 may not be taken to satisfy an elective for Biophysical/Forensic emphasis students. It may, however, be used to satisfy the biophysical anthropology subdiscipline requirement for the archaeology or cultural anthropology student.
- 2. Temporarily, ANTH 118 and ANTH 117 can satisfy the cultural or biophysical elective requirement.
- 3. Students should consider a minor!
- 4. ANTH 30 does not satisfy elective requirements in the major.
- 5. ANTH 130 can satisfy either the cultural or archaeology elective requirement.
- 6. G.E. and MI courses can be double counted with major requirements. The writing requirement may be met by taking the upper-division writing exam. This total indicates that Anth 2 or 3 in G.E. Breadth D3 may be applied to the Anthropology major. Consult the department chair or faculty advisor for additional details.
