Elective Curriculum (15 units minimum) (see advising Note #3): *In addition to the Core Curriculum, Methodological Training, and Internship, each student, in consultation with an advisor, will select the following:*

- 3 upper-division classes within the student's area of concentration (e.g. cultural anthropology, archaeology, or biophysical anthropology (9 units)
- 2 upper-division classes, one in each remaining subdiscipline (e.g., an archaeology student would take one cultural and one biophysical course) (6 units)

Minors and Certificates: *Students may benefit from a minor certificate program. If a student completes an approved Certificate, then they will be Exempt from one elective in their area of emphasis; please consult an advisor.*

Degree Requirements: *Anthropology Major (45 units) + Degree Requirements = 120 units*

- General Education requirements (49 units)
- Other requirements (9 units): American Government and Institutions (PLSI 2), Multicultural and International (MI), and Upper-Division writing (W).
- Sufficient elective units to meet required total units (varies) (See Advising Notes #3 and #4)

Advising Notes:

1. Anth 161 may not be taken to satisfy an elective for Biophysical/Forensic emphasis students. It may, however, be used to satisfy the biophysical anthropology elective requirement for the archaeology or cultural anthropology student.
2. Temporarily, ANTH 118 and ANTH 117 can satisfy the cultural or biophysical elective requirement.
3. Students should consider a minor!
4. ANTH 30 does not satisfy elective requirements in the major.
5. ANTH 130 can satisfy either the cultural or archaeology elective requirement.
6. G.E. and MI courses can be double counted with major requirements. The writing requirement may be met by taking the upper-division writing exam. This total indicates that Anth 2 or 3 in G.E. Breadth D3 may be applied to the Anthropology major. Consult the department chair or faculty advisor for additional details.
