The History Graduate Student Association (HGSA) at California State University, Fresno announces the return of the Annual History Graduate Student Symposium, which will be held on **Saturday May 7th, 2022** in Fresno, California. This will be a hybrid event that includes in-person and online panel discussions.

The theme for the 22nd Annual History Graduate Student Symposium will be **Negotiating Spaces/Pushing Boundaries**. Negotiating spaces refers to areas such as geographical borders, the household, workplace, and society where discussions, interactions, and engagements occurred that shape history. Pushing boundaries refers to research/studies that push the scope of historiographical knowledge into new realms.

We invite graduate students from History Departments and other related fields to submit proposals for papers, from diverse historical and geographical backgrounds, as well as historiographical and methodological approaches to history.

Paper proposals should be no more than **250** words and include a short biographical paragraph which includes your name, school affiliation, status, and research interests. Please indicate in your proposal whether you want to present in-person or online. These proposals should be sent to
